
## Janet Honda completes 1<sup>st</sup> term as Hawaii Federation President

Many Ka'u residents will remember Gladys Yonemitsu, who was a teacher for many years at Na`alehu School. Gladys died last year and her love of cooking is now remembered by her friends with a cookbook dedicated to her memory. Many of Gladys' favorite recipes were collected by Gladys Nakamura and these form the core of the cookbook. Many of her friends contributed favorite recipes of their own so the book contains a collection of 240 recipes, all someone's favorites. The book has an emphasis on Japanese cooking, and there is an excellent chapter on "The Art of Japanese Cooking" by Rev. Earl Ikeda. However the recipes have been adapted to Hawaiian tastes and availability of spices etc, and there are many recipes from other cultures. The recipes were compiled and edited by Rev. David Fujimoto, Carol Tsunezumi and Marge and Dennis Elwell, and each section is introduced by a line drawing by Masako Sakata and Marla McCasland.
