Introduction of the Sosai-sama (Honorary President of the World Federation of Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha)

As the tradition of Jodo Shinshu was transmitted from Sokunyo Monshu (Koshin Ohtani Gomonshu) to Sennyō Monshu (Kojun Ohtani Gomonshu) on June 6, 2014, Lady Ruzumi Ohtani took the position of the Honorary President of the World Federation of Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha. Lady Ruzumi Ohtani married Kojun Ohtani Shinmon-sama in March 2006 and gave birth to their first son (Takashi-sama) in May 2011.

At the Opening Service of the Buddhist Women's Federation of Japan's Council Meeting, Lady Ruzumi Ohtani said, "I think it is important for us to listen to the teaching with an understanding that the Amida Buddha's Working is directed to each of us, and also to transmit the joy of encountering the teaching. I would like to put my efforts together with each of you." We, the members of Honpa Hongwanji Mission of Hawaii Federation of Buddhist Women's Association, would like to strive to conduct BWA activities centered on the Onembutsu under the guidance of the new Sosai-sama (Honorary President).

Lady Noriko Ohtani served as the President of the World Federation of Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha from April 1984 to June 2014 for 30 years. During her presidency, Lady Noriko Ohtani visited Hawaii Kyodan on several occasions for such as the World Federation Representatives Meeting in April 2004, the 13th World Buddhist Women's Convention in September 2006, and the Shinran Shonin's 750th Memorial and HHMH 120th Anniversary Celebration in September 2009, and those were truly great privileges for Hawaii Kyodan.

This year marked the 30th year for Kahului Hale Makua Obon dance. On that warm summer evening, our members arrived to a transformed outdoor festival. Assorted colorful chochin lanterns and lights decorated the circular front driveway making a perfect dance ring. The patients, staff and residents, along with their family members were seated around the outer ring of the driveway circle. Against the backdrop of a clear evening sky, the rising full moon

greeted everyone as the first dance, "Tanko Bushi" began. Amid the dancers in their yukatas and happi coats, elderly residents joined in with their caregivers, who guided their wheelchairs as dance partners. The dancing wheelchairs in sync with the melody, kept time with the "heart beat" of the taiko drums. On the sidelines there was clapping and many whose graceful hand motions mirrored the dancers in the ring. Behind the background music, with smiles and sharing of nostalgic memories, everyone enjoyed snacking on traditional treats such as mochi and manju donated by the families.

In closing, the rapid taiko drumming of "Fukushima Ondo," gave way to the final dance, "Beautiful

Sunday". As families and friends said their goodbyes, the residents were escorted back to their rooms. It was the ending of another enjoyable Obon to remember. With anticipation we left looking forward to next year, as we continue the joy of our Obon tradition. Odorimasho !
